

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

In the unlikely event of postponement due to bad weather or any other circumstance beyond the control of the Organisers, the Ride will be held on Saturday 5th May 2012. Entries will automatically be carried over and no entry fees will be refundable.

1. PRIZES

Each competitor who has **paid the required sponsorship** amount and completed the course will receive a rosette in recognition of their contribution to the event. Two trophies will be awarded: one for the highest amount raised by an adult (16 and over), one for under 16. A challenge trophy will be awarded for highest sponsorship raised by a member or subscriber of the Berks & Bucks Draghounds.

2. THE COURSE

The ride will be approximately ten miles long. It will include various purely optional jumps, all of which can be easily avoided, without penalty, by those preferring to enjoy a ride in some beautiful countryside without jumping. Several of the jumps will have easier and harder alternatives. The two crossings of the River Wye are a particularly popular feature for most riders, but can be avoided if preferred. This is not a competition and it is envisaged that everyone should be able to complete the course. Time does not count, but the course is normally completed within two hours.

3. SPONSORSHIP

Minimum sponsorship is £25 for riders 16 years of age and over, and £20 for riders under 16 years of age. It is hoped that most people will manage to exceed this minimum. **Sponsorship money is to be paid on the day before setting out on the ride.**

4. ENTRIES

- Each rider pays a non-refundable entry fee of £20.00, which must be enclosed with the entry form, together with a stamped addressed envelope for starting times. Cheques should be made payable to **Berks & Bucks Sponsored Ride**.
- All the entrants on each entry form will be given the same starting time unless otherwise requested.

- On receipt of entry forms, competitors will be allocated a starting time and notified of this time. Preferred starting times will be arranged wherever possible but cannot be guaranteed.
- Postal entries close Sunday 1st April 2012. Late credit card entries by phone may be accepted at the Secretary's discretion.

5. RULES

- It is a condition of entry that **sponsorship money is paid on the day before setting out on the ride.**
- All riders must wear hats conforming to PAS 015:1998, EN1384:1996, BSEN 1384:1997 with BSI Kitemark, Snell E2001 with official label and number or AS/NZS 3838:1998/2003.
- Horses and ponies must be four years old and upwards.
- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times
- Only three attempts are allowed at any jump
- Passing is allowed
- The B&B Drag, The Charities, The Organising Committee, The Land Owners, all persons and all organisations involved in the Ride disclaim all liability for any damage to any person or property, howsoever caused, whether by negligence or otherwise. It is up to participants and spectators to make their own insurance arrangements.
- The decision of the Committee on any matter shall be final.
- Failure to carry out instructions from a steward may lead to disqualification
